

alligator caimán alligator ...a large reptile with short legs, a long body and tail, and a long, wide snout. Alligators are protected by thick skin with many hard bumps. They live in rivers, lakes, swamps, and other bodies of water in the southeast United States and in China.

...a large furry mammal with a short tail. Bears are omnivorous; they may eat plants, honey, insects, fish, and small mammals. There are several kinds of bears, including black, brown, grizzly and polar.


...a small, furry mammal with whiskers, short ears, and a long tail. Cats, also called house cats, are often kept as pets or to catch mice and rats.





#### chien (male) chienne (female)

... a furry animal with four legs, a pointed nose, and a tail. Dogs are mammals, closely related to coyotes, foxes, and wolves. There are many kinds or breeds of dogs, with a wide range of sizes and appearances. Some dogs are bred for special jobs, such as herding sheep. Dogs are often kept as pets.



... an enormous mammal with a very long nose called a trunk.
Elephants have curved tusks, huge,

floppy ears, and four long, thick legs. Elephants use their trunks to pick up food, drink water, or lift things. They use their tusks to dig roots. Elephants travel in herds, eating tons

of plants every day.




... a wild mammal that has a pointed nose, pointed ears, and a bushy tail. Closely related to coyotes, dogs, and wolves. Foxes hunt insects, birds, and other small animals. They will sometimes eat plants, especially fruit.

### Gg giraffe jirafa girafe

... a mammal with a very long neck, long legs, and hooves. Giraffes have short horns covered with fur. They live in Africa and eat the tops of trees. Male giraffes can be up to eighteen feet tall. They can turn their necks in complete circles. They are the tallest animal that lives on land.



nose and a very short tail. Hedgehogs have brown and yellow fur with spines that stick out and protect them when they roll into a ball. They make tunnels in rows of bushes called hedges. Hedgehogs are mammals that eat insects. Different kinds of hedgehogs live in Europe, Asia, and Africa.



... a large mammal with short yellow fur and black rings. Jaguars are carnivores that hunt or fish for food. They live in the southern United States as well as Central and South America. Jaguars are closely related to lions, tigers, and other big cats. They are sometimes called panthers.



... a mammal with gray fur, round ears, and a short black nose. Koalas are marsupials


and live in trees. The female has a pouch in her belly where she carries her baby. Koalas are only found in Australia. They are sometimes called "koala bears," but they are not related to true bears.




...a small, furry mammal with large, round eyes and a long tail. They are active mainly at night. Lemurs are found in Madagascar, a large island country near the eastern coast of Africa, and in nearby islands.



... a mammal that lives in the ocean and has flippers for front legs. Manatees eat sea plants and are very gentle. Different kinds of manatees live near the shores or in coastal rivers of Florida, the West Indies, Central America, South America, and West Africa. They are also called sea cows.



... an arctic aquatic mammal related to the dolphin, that has a spotted pelt and, on the male, a long spirally twisted ivory tusk projecting from the upper jaw.



... a bird with large eyes set in front of a large head, a strong, hooked beak, and strong, sharp claws. Owls are most active at night and hunt other animals for food. There are many different kinds of owls.



... a large black-and-white mammal that is related to bears. They live in the mountains of western China and eat only bamboo plants. They are also called giant pandas.




### Qq quail codorniz caille

... a bird related to the chicken that lives on the ground and is often hunted for sport and food.

... a small mammal with long ears and long back legs for running or jumping. Rabbits have soft fur and a short tail. They are herbivores with long front teeth. Some kinds of rabbits make tunnels or burrows in the ground. Cottontails and hares are kinds of rabbits.



... a reptile with a soft body covered by a hard shell that lives in water or on land. A turtle pulls its head, legs, and tail into its shell for protection.





... an wild sheep of southern and central Asia which is reddish brown and the males have a beard from the neck to the chest.

# VV vicuna vicuña vigogne

... a wild cloven-hoofed, cudchewing mammal of South America that is related to the llama but is smaller and has a silky fleece. Twenty-five vicunas are sheared to make one overcoat.






... a large mammal with tusks and thick, brown skin. Walruses are the largest pinnipeds or mammals with four flippers instead of feet. They spend much of their time on beaches or on frozen ocean in Arctic regions. Walruses are closely related to sea lions and seals.



The Xantus' hummingbird was named after John Xantus de Vesey, a Hungarian zoologist. They are mainly green in color with black cheeks and a bright white stripe behind each eye. Its calls are loud and metallic. It uses its long bill and extendable tongue to obtain nectar from flowers.




...a large, heavy mammal with long hair. Yaks are closely related to cattle. They live in Tibet and Central Asia. People raise yaks to carry loads and for their milk, fur, and leather. Very few yaks are left in the wild.




of becoming extinct.




























