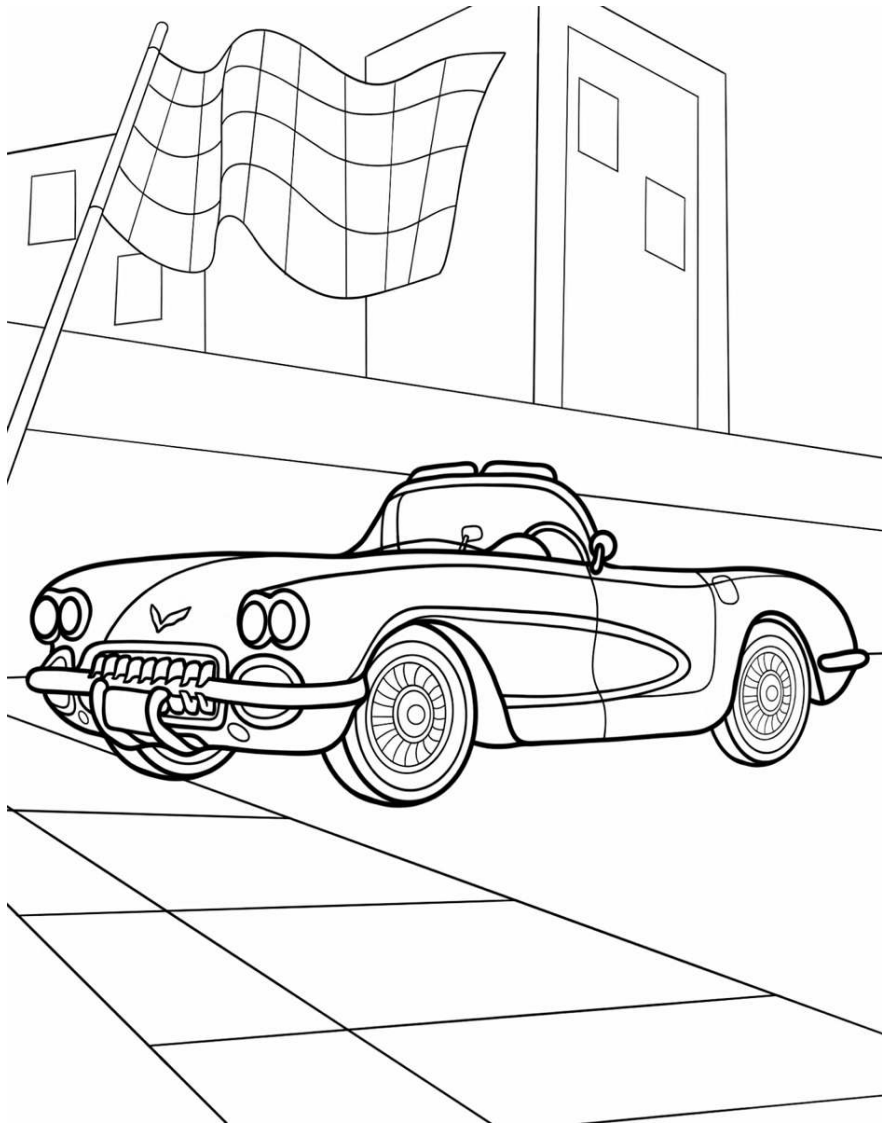

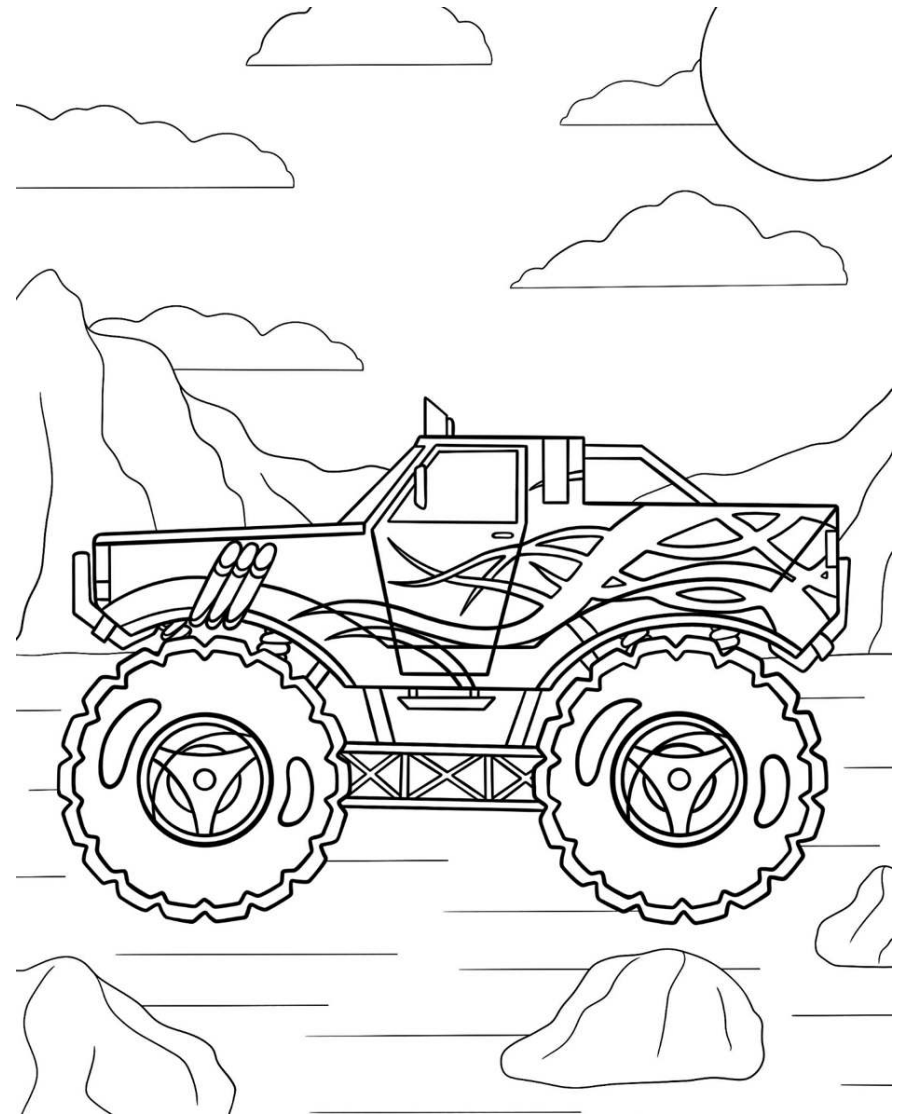

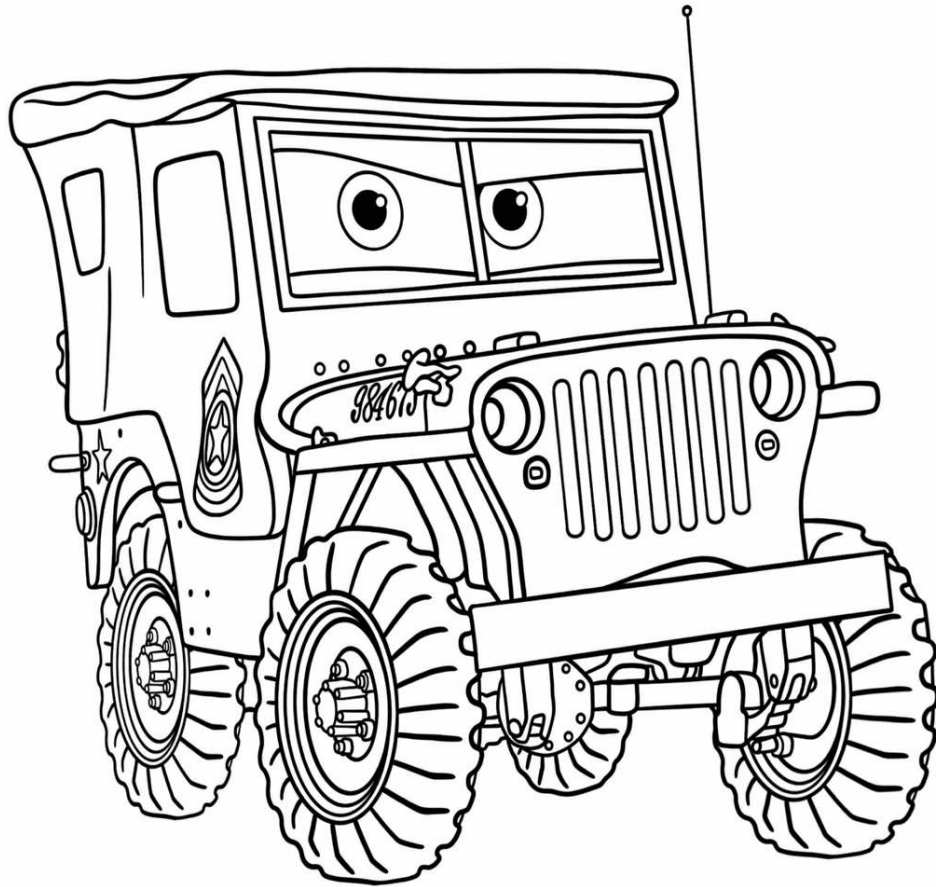
The first car made was in 1886 in Germany by Carl Benz

One in four cars on the UK's road were made in China



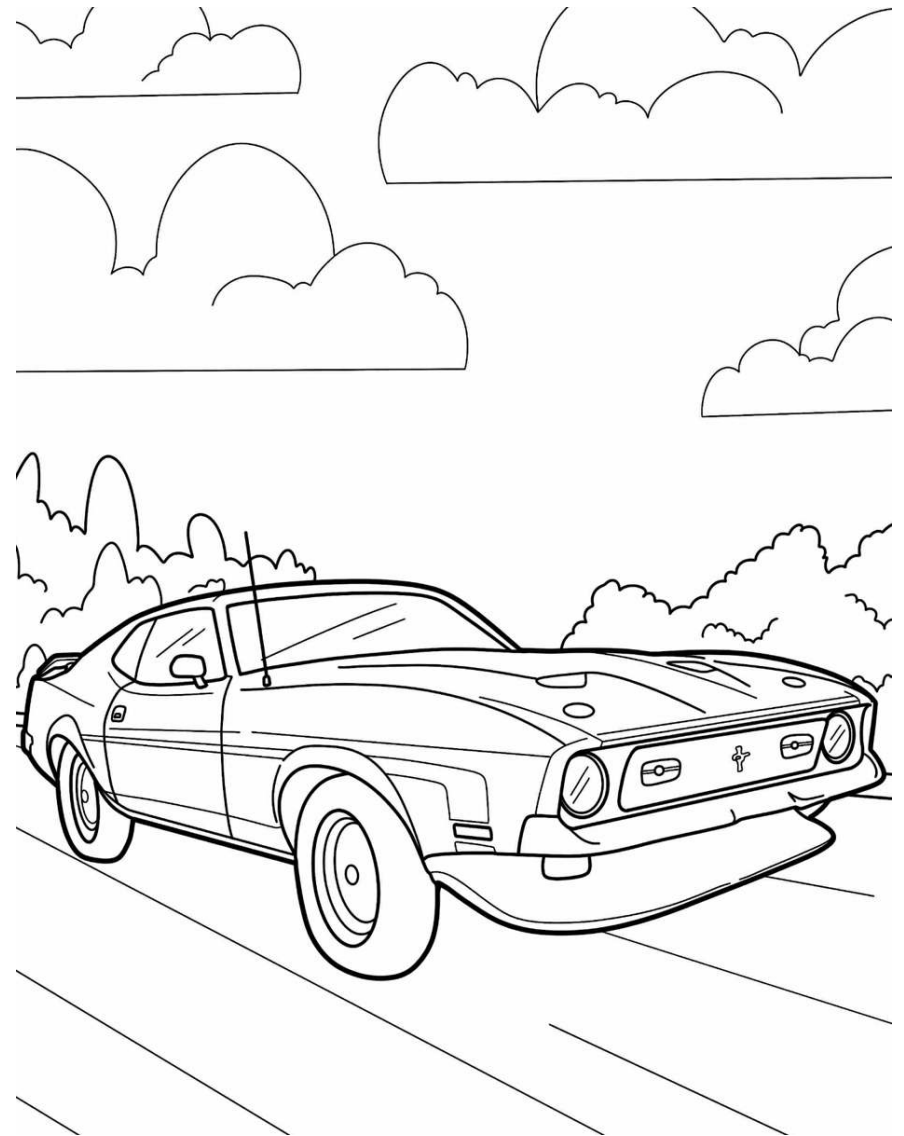
The average British driver will spend around 99 days of

and you could get to the moon in under a month.



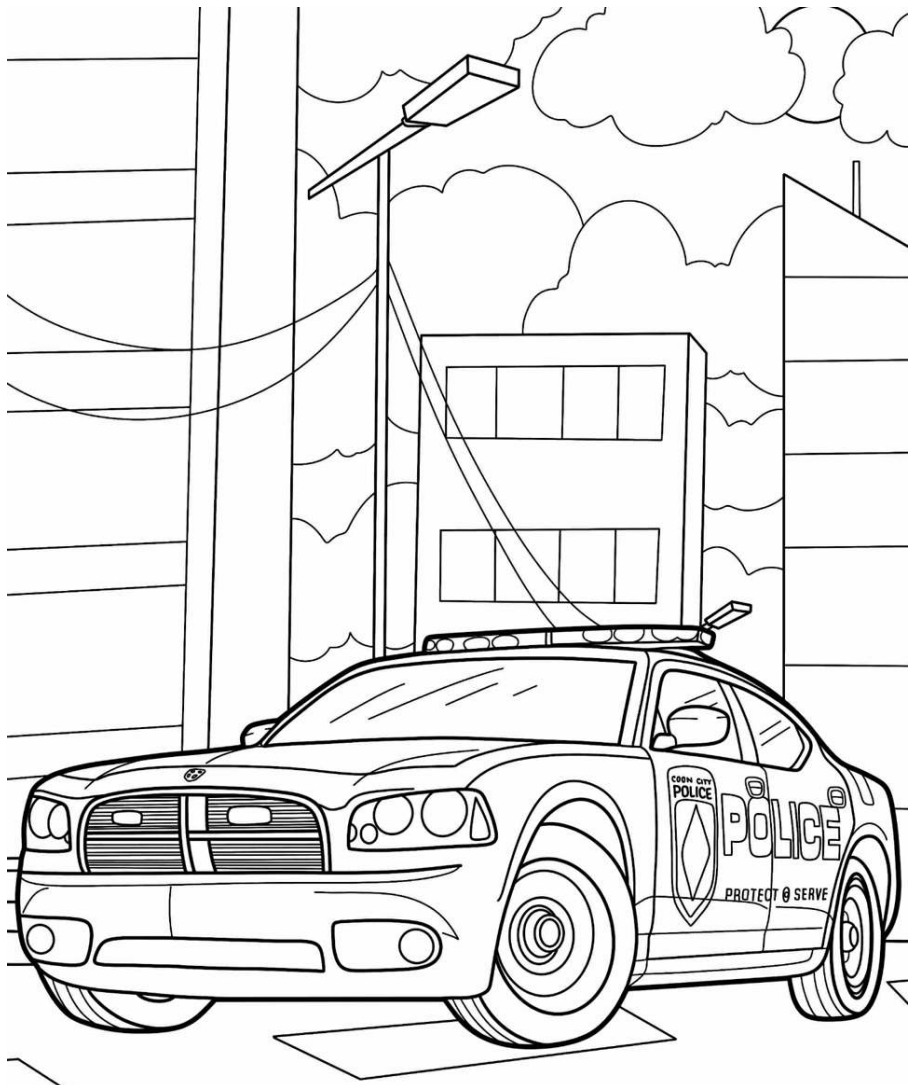
The highest total mileage clocked by a single car is 2,850,000 million miles. That's equivalent to driving around the Earth 100 times.

In June 1940, the U.S. Army asked automakers to create a quarter ton "light reconnaissance vehicle" specifically for the Army's unique needs during World War II. Of the 135 automakers solicited, only 3 responded – Bantam, Willys, and Ford.

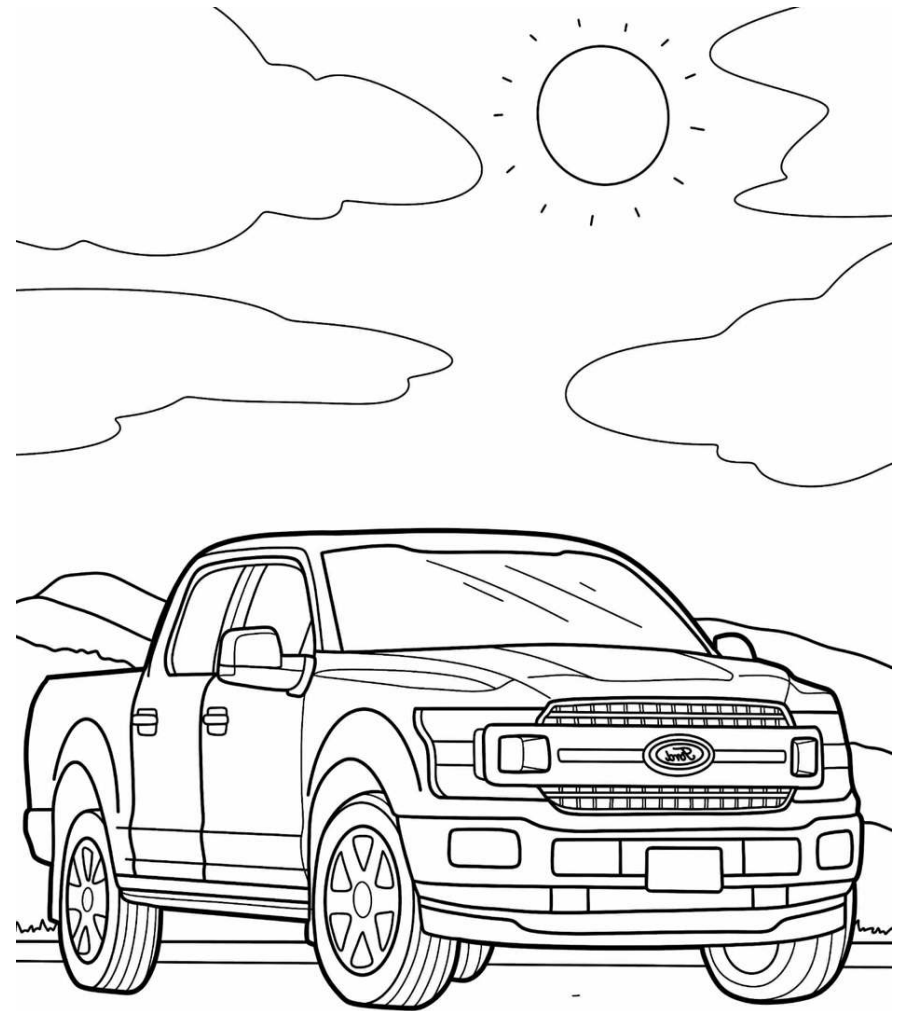
75% of all cars produced by Rolls Royce are still on the road.
